FAQs about the IDL SIG Scholarship

Q: How many scholarships are offered each year? A: The SIG awards two scholarships, one for Master's/Ph.D. students and one for Certificate students. Both types of applicants must be taking courses at the graduate level. You do not need to be an IDL SIG member to apply.

Q: Do you offer a scholarship to undergraduate students?

A: We no longer offer an undergraduate scholarship.

Q: Must all of my application materials, including letters of recommendation, be submitted before the deadline?

A: Yes, we must receive all of your materials by the deadline stated on the application.

The IDL SIG scholarship awards range as high as \$750 for the top Master's/Ph.D. applicant and \$500 for the top Certificate applicant.

Q: What is the criteria for winning scholarships? **A:** Six criteria are used:

- 1. Strength of recommendations
- 2. Relevance of research to the field (Master's/Ph.D.)
- 3. Completed coursework relevant to the field
- 4. Writing quality of the application
- 5. Estimated likelihood of continuing in the field
- 6. Additional observations by judges

The five judges come from our IDL SIG membership, which includes many highly qualified men and women in the fields such as instructional design, educational technology, instructional systems, and technical communications.
